- Students need to understand that they are going to make mistakes and they need to give themselves grace.
- Kids need to practice giving themselves encouragement and practice mindfulness.

When we are regulated, we are kinder and more respectful. We are able to focus and perform better. In addition, our emotions and behaviors are easier to managt


While dysregulated, their mind may race, their heart can beat quickly, have high energy, they can feel angry, scared, or overly excited. Kids can use strategies to help them get back in the green.

## A Script from the Clinic

Hearing Screens for students in grades 1 and 4 will take place in February.
If your student DOES NOT pass this screenings, a letter will be sent home informing you of the results. Please review the information in the letter sent home and have your physician fill out the necessary information. Please return it back with your child as soon as possible. Please call me if you have any questions. Any student that is new to Cedar Canyon will also receive vision and hearing screenings.

## Band Invitation

4th grade students got their recorders in January! Recorders, while maybe not every parent's favorite music unit, are one of the oldest instruments we have record of. They are great for teaching students the value of practicing something until you can do it right, determination, hand-eye coordination, and processing skills. It takes a lot of brain power to read a note in the music, figure out which letter it is, remember how to play it on an instrument, and play the instrument with a good sound-all while keeping a steady beat! They're also many of our students' first instruments they've owned and are a great steppingstone to 5th grade band for students who are interested. Recorders may have already come home, or they will come home soon (they aren't sent home until the class can play a harder song with good technique!). Thank you for encouraging your child to practice something new!

## A Peek into Music Class:

3rd grade- We worked on form, which is the music is put together. For this lesson, each student got a colored flashlight that was assigned a certain part of the music. In this song, during the first part of the song William Tell Overture, a blue flashlight would shine, but for the next part that sounds different, students with red flashlights would shine their lights. During a third part, students with a purple flashlight would shine their flashlights.

4th grade- Day 1 of recorder! We learned the notes B, A, and G. When your child brings their recorder home, see if they can play a song for you from their book!
